This list is based on the ideas of Bruce Weigle and Jean-Marc Largeaud. It was to be used for the supplement Bruce wrote for his "1870" ruleset. This information is reproduced here as a collaboration with Jean-Marc Largeaud. Some minor editing has been completed by Keith McNelly.

The miniatures are from the a number of ranges which are all referenced.

INFANTRY

Regulars in Kepis/Soft Caps: NCF 1 French infantry Marching or NCF 2 French Infantry Attacking (Franco Prussian War range) and/or NCF 3 French Chasseurs Attacking. (Franco Prussian War range). Note Use these figures for all regiments except the 18th Regiment (see below). NCF 1 / NCF 2 have greatcoat but the French Chasseurs are a good alternative. Jean-Marc recommends bith while Bruce Weigle uses Chasseurs only.

Regulars in Shakos: NCP 3 Prussian Jaegers Advancing (Franco-Prussian War range) or MAN 1 Austrian Musketeers in Shako or MAN 13 Austrian Musketeers in Shako Attacking (Napoleonic range). *Note use these figures only for the 18th Regiment only. None of these figures are perfect*).

Guards (Livgarde): In bearskins MFN 43 French Old Guard Attacking (Napoleonic range) or if in soft cap use the codes previous. *Note the Guards were not engaged but may enter the field in "what if"scenarios.*

CAVALRY:

Dragoons: NCF 6 French Dragoons or NCP 14 Bavarian Light Horse. (Franco-Prussian War range. Some attention is required to the headgear in both packs).

Guard Hussars: MACW 4 Federal Cavalry (American Civil War range. These are not perfect).

In case you need the only squadron of Heavies in the Danish Guard :

Royal Horse Guard: NCP 9 Prussian Cuirassiers (Franco-Prussian War range). *Note there was only squadron of heavies in the Danish Guard.*

ARTILLERY

Gunners: Crew from MACW 5 and MACW 22 Artillery (American Civil War range)Cannon: NCF 7 French Artillery (Franco-Prussian War range) with some ACW guns.Artillery Train: NCF14 French Gun Teams (Franco-Prussian War range).

GENERALS & STAFF

Mounted French Officers from the FPW infantry packs, and MACW 4 Federal Cavalry
