

French Revolutionary Army 1792-1799 in 6mm

It will be noted that in some cases Seven Years War figures in tricorns have been suggested. The early bicorne was relatively low and had many similarities to the tricorn. Therefore, the figures suggested can be used to model the early bicorne without modification.

INFANTRY

The infantry are described in three parts:

1. "Old" Army in 1792 & Later:

Line: MSY 29 Hungarians Musketeers.

Grenadiers: MSY 5 Austrian Musketeers and/or MSY 6, MSY 23 or MSY 24 Austrian Grenadiers Firing for grenadiers in fur caps.

Fusiliers: MGN 1 Bavarian Napoleonic Fusiliers.

2. Garde Nationale & Volunteers:

MSY 5 Austrian Musketeers, MSY 21 Austrian Musketeers Attacking, MSY 22 Austrian Musketeers Firing.

3. Troops in "Demi-Brigades":

Line: MFN 41 Infantry in Bicorn and MFN 42 Infantry in Bicorn Attacking.

Light infantry: MFN 41 Infantry in Bicorn and MFN 42 Infantry in Bicorn Attacking.

Chasseurs Skirmishing: MSN 3 Spanish Musketeers Skirmishing.

Carabiniers: MFN 5 Grenadiers of the Old Guard and MFN 20 Chasseurs of the Old Guard

CAVALRY

Cavalry in Bicorn: MSY 18 Prussian Dragoons Charging, MSY 7 Austrian Dragoons, MSN 4 Spanish Dragoons

Chasseurs: MBN 20 British Light Dragoons in Tarleton Helmets

Dragoons: MBN 2 British Heavy Dragoons

Hussars & Legions: MSY 10 Prussian Hussars

ARTILLERY

Artillery: MSY 32 Prussian Horse Artillery and Napoleonic Gribeauval guns
